WHAT IS PROBUS?

A **PROBUS** Club is a local association of retired and semi-retired people who have had some measure of responsibility in any field of worthy endeavour, who are of character and respected in their communities.

Clubs meet regularly for fellowship and to provide regular opportunities for them to keep their minds active, expand their interests, and try to enjoy the fellowship of new friends.

Our focus is on:" Fun, Friendship, and Fellowship."

Each club is autonomous and chooses its own rules and programme. Some clubs meet weekly, some monthly, some twice a month. Some have coffee mornings with guest speakers, some have lunches or dinners. Many organise day trips and holidays to which partners and friends may be invited if the club so chooses.

Each club elects its own officers, typically a president, vice-president, secretary, treasurer, speaker-finder and membership secretary.

PROBUS Clubs do not exist to raise money for charity, although some choose to run occasional fund-raising events and raffles for the benefit of their members.
